Article 21/A



The electronic documents is sent from the signatory's workplace . and they shall be deemed received at the consignee's workplace. If they do not have any workplace, the place of residence shall be deemed the workplace

Article 21/B



If the signatory and the consignee have more than one workplace, the workplace closely related to the transaction shall be deemed the place of sending or receiving, and when it is not possible to determine, the main workplace shall be deemed the place of sending or receiving
