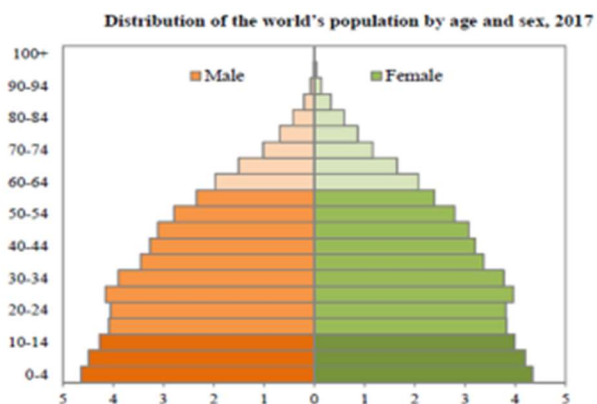

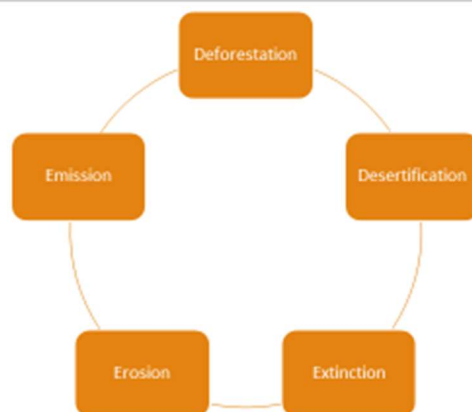

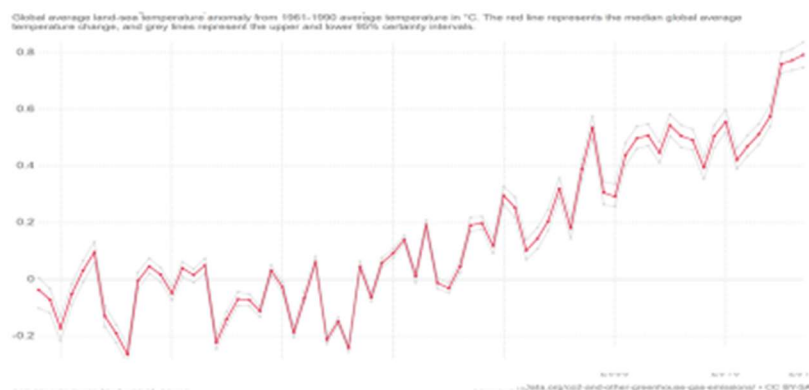

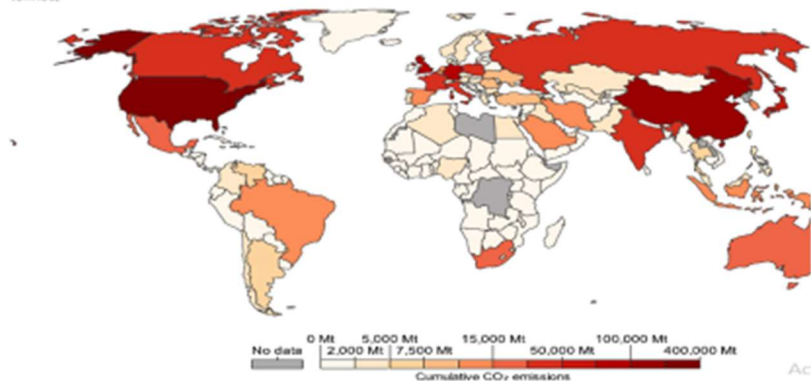


Global average Temperature Anomaly



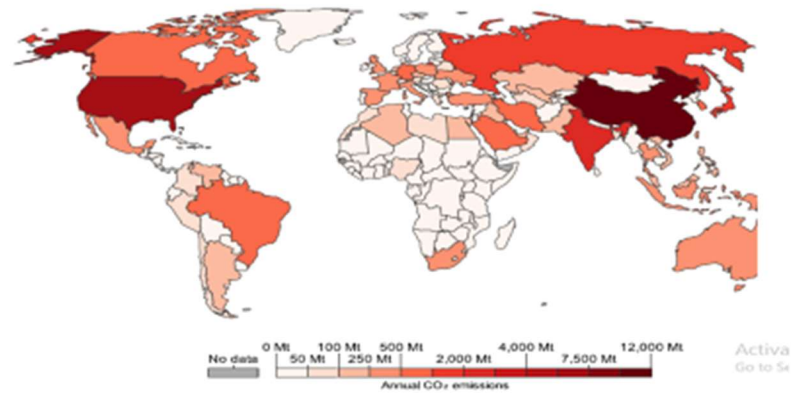
Cumulative CO₂ Emissions

Cumulative carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions represents the total sum of CO₂ emissions since 1751, and is measured in tonnes.

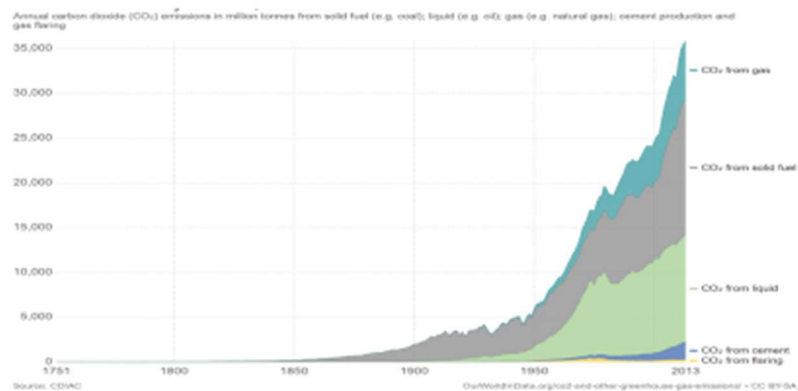


Annual CO₂ emissions per country

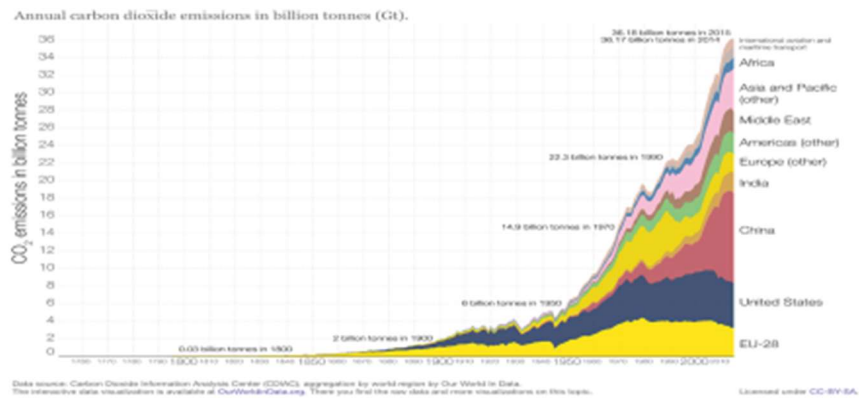
Annual carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions, measured in million tonnes (Mt) per year.



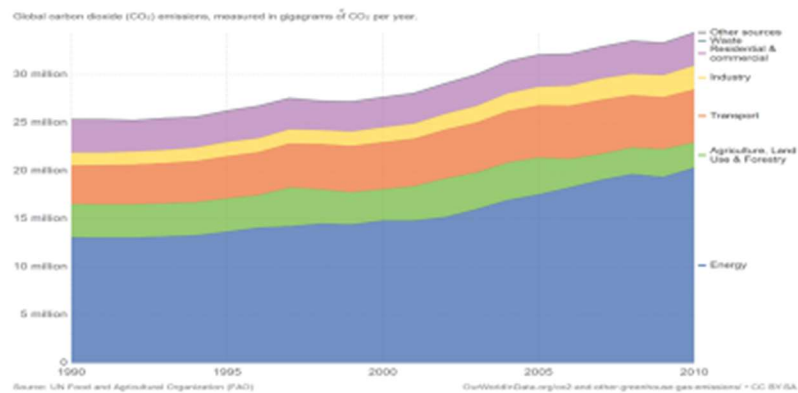
CO₂ emissions by source



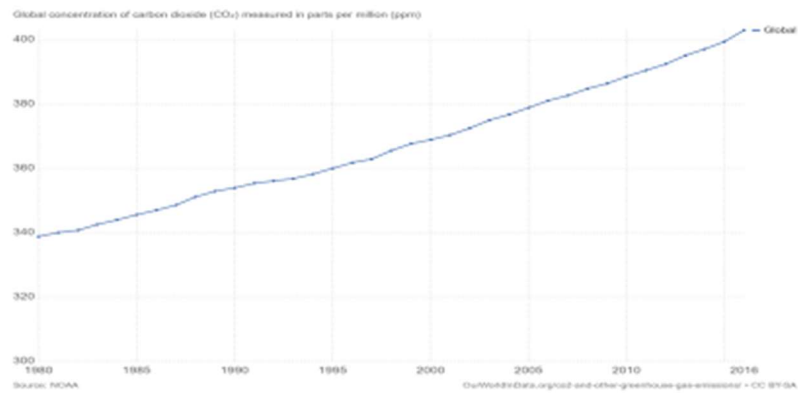
Global CO₂ emissions by world region, 1751 to 2015



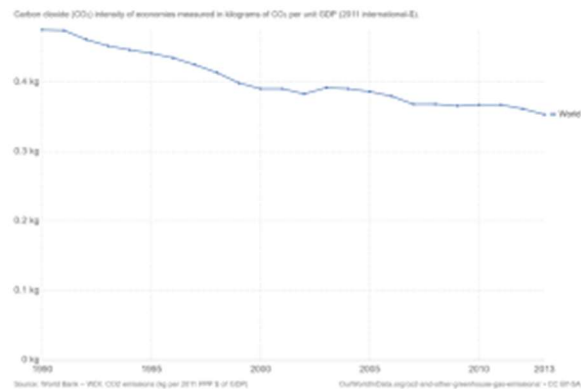
Global CO₂ emissions by sector
